

SMALL CHURCH FACTS

- 1. 70% of churches (all denominations) are under 100 members*
- 1. In 2023, 56% of Episcopal congregations were NOT served by a full time priest, meaning they were either lay-led, had a PT priest or relied on a retire/inactive priest**
- In 2024, the average Episcopal congregation attendance was about 51.

Common Characteristics of Small Churches:

- A warm and family-like atmosphere
- Opportunities for deep involvement in the mission and ministries of the church
- Children are known, loved and "raised up" in the church
- Often times more adaptable with less organizational structure than larger churches
- Welcome is often very informal without a systematic approach
- Connection may be hard for a newcomer because of strong internal relationships

As a general rule, churches that are not offering any kind of biblical formation are not growing.

Nurturing Spiritual Growth

- Provide regular formation opportunities
- Bible study and and topical or themed adult forums
- Book studies are ideal for community invitation
- People come to a church to build their spiritual life



Connection to a Community of Believers

Provide regular fellowship opportunities

Include a diversity of activity

 Be intentional about planning for a variety of ages

Empty chair opportunities



Invite a newcomer into a

Altar guild, choir, etc

Small churches offer something that larger churches struggle with: a church family where members are known and loved





Connect with the Wider Community

 Every church needs some kind of outreach for new members to connect with

 Engage in prayerful discernment as an entire community about how to best move outside the walls of the church Where is the community hub?


Ask yourselves, "how can we be present there?"

Is there a need in your community that your church can meet? Assess what's happening and what is needed.

Join together in a book study or regular gatherings to pray for God's guidance


