- 5) Is there a place for me to serve?






Greeters and Ushers




Visitor vs. Guest INTERNAL LANGUAGE Visitor (definition)


A visitor is someone who comes and goes without much thought or preparation on our part.

First Time Visitor Facts




• If a visitor is not greeted within the first few minutes of walking through the door they are not likely to come back.



- 1) Smile and have the ability to talk to visitors easily and warmly, and with patience and compassion.
- 2) Be intuitive (reading body language) know when to ask questions and when to give visitors space.
- 3) Vigilance to remain aware of visitors.
- 4) Reasonably regular attendance at church and reliable attendance at assigned services.
- 5) Familiarity with what's in the bulletins. Special services, upcoming ministry events and other goings on.

Greeter & Usher Musts

Greeters & Ushers Duties

- 1) Be deployed to greet people before and AFTER the service.
- 2) 10/5 Rule 10 feet away. Smile and make eye contact. 5 feet away, verbally greet them.
- 3) Encourage visitors to complete a Connect card if they have not already. Mention we have a weekly e-blast and if they'd like to know more about Ascension's goings on we can add their email to the list. Be willing to follow up with them if you've made a connection.
- 4) Be sure they're introduced to a staff/clergy member, or someone who is in their age/stage of life.
- 5) Invite them to coffee hour.



What to Say.

Welcome to Ascension! We're glad you're here. I'm

Catherine. I don't believe we've met.

Group discussion (how to respond.) - 2 minutes each

"My name is Charlie and I've been a member here for 40 years."

"Thank you. This our first visit here."

What to Say (continued)

If you sense they're interested....

What brings you to Ascension today?

Do you live nearby?

Have you been to an Episcopal church before?

Do you have any questions for me?
